
We have very much welcomed the European Commission's plan to present at the end of this year the "Digital Services Act Package". Deepening the single market for digital services should foster Europe's digital sovereignty and competitiveness, unlock our digital potential and provide equal opportunities. The forthcoming Digital Services Act (DSA) package may contribute to achieving this goal. We believe it will facilitate smooth functioning of the increasingly growing platform-based ecosystem where good ruled-based interactions between its players will benefit all.

Therefore, it is our pleasure to submit, for your consideration, the position of the Government of the Republic of Poland regarding the envisaged DSA submitted within the framework of the public consultation the European Commission carried out this summer. The non-paper is the result of cooperation between the Prime Minister's Chancellery, the Ministry of Digital Affairs, the Ministry of Development, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Office for Electronic Communication and the Office of Competition and Consumer Protection. It outlines the main position of the Polish Government with regard to the EU market for digital services. In particular the document focuses on the following three pillars:

- we share our assessment of the e-Commerce Directive and the need for its revision,
- we discuss possible ex ante rules for online companies acting as gatekeepers,
- we are presenting our stance on disinformation.

We would like the DSA package to be a forward-looking, technologically neutral and flexible solution, enough to respond to the rapid pace of changes observed in the digital sector. We want to assure you that we offer our fullest support in moving this file forward during the works in the EU Council and later on - during negotiations with the European Parliament.
